This week we have said goodbye to Miss Cain, one of our wonderful Communication Support Workers. Miss Cain is taking up a post at the University and we are so excited for her. But we will miss her smile, enthusiasm and positivity and thank her for the skill and expertise she has shared. She leaves knowing she was one of the initial team that have created a fantastic Deaf Base here at school and we are so grateful to her.

We look forward to welcoming Mr David Sherry to our school, who will take up the post now vacant in the Spring term. He comes to us with a wealth of experience working with deaf children across primary and secondary and we are excited to see all the gifts he will be able to bring to our school.

If any member of your household has symptoms of the virus you must not enter the school site. By law, that person must self isolate for 10 days from the start of symptoms, if there have been no symptoms but a positive test result you should isolate for 10 days from the result. You may return to school on day 11 if there has not been a high temperature for 48 hours and that person has been well. Others in the household should self isolate for 14 days from the positive persons symptoms starting or if someone begins with symptoms during this time, they should isolate for a further 10 days from the onset of these.

At the time of writing we still have not sent a year group home. Thank you to everyone for your efforts

A gentle reminder on some points that are easy to forget and make a huge difference to us being able to hold the virus at bay in school:

Please do not arrive before your child's time to enter and queue outside school. The number of people waiting is increasing. If you arrive just after the start time, your child can just walk in. More children are arriving too late. It is so important that they are on time to stay in their bubbles. Staff are having to risk breaking bubbles if they have to take children in to classes late.

Please wear a facemask when you enter school grounds.

Please keep your children next to you when on school grounds, do not let them run around and into other family bubbles. Keep a social distance between your household groups and others.

Please can only 1 person walk around school to collect children.

Please do try and get medical appointments out of school hours or ask for them to be moved to a school holiday when it is sent to you. If your child does have an appointment that you cannot change, then they **can not return to school after the appointment** and preferably should not come into school at all on that day. All staff are in their own bubbles so it is difficult to arrange for young children to be escorted to the door to be collected.

A big thank you once again to the staff for all their efforts at school and at home ensuring they do not put your children and their own families at risk and enabling us to keep school running as close to normal as possible.

Mrs Bayliss is holding a Virtual SEND parents meeting on Wednesday 9th December at 1.30pm. It will be a chance to find out about the different strategies used at school and answer any questions. She will also arrange a 1 to 1 follow up session to answer any personal needs and questions about your child. Look out for the letter with a slip to return if you are interested.

She is also sending out a leaflet giving ideas to how best support your child at the end of the school day. This can be a difficult time for many as they move from the bustle of school classroom to the smaller, quieter time at home. We hope you find it useful.
