We were very distressed to hear a complaint from a parent who was waiting outside school with their dog last week. Children had climbed on

the air raid shelter at the front of school and were throwing stones at the dog. Please do supervise your children after picking up from school. This is simply unacceptable behaviour and cruelty to animals.

Children **SHOULD NOT BE CLIMBING ON THAT AIR RAID SHELTER.** It is not safe.

Please do stop your children from running on this.

A reminder again that **KS1 and EY children should not** play on the KS2 equipment at the end of the day. It is designed for KS2 children and so is not safe for smaller, younger children. Our risk assessment does not cover younger children. Please do not let an accident have to happen to enforce this.

No parent cars should be on the car park at the **beginning or end of day.** It is a private car park for staff and whereas in the past we may have been able to allow disable badge holders, we now have too many transport taxis for our Deaf Base for this to be safe. Sadly, we must therefore maintain it as a private car park and ask everyone to park outside. Thank you for your help with all of this.
