#### **Proud to be Warstonians!**

This week has been particularly busy in school but it is one which has made me particularly proud! After a hard week of SATS, Y6 have been enjoying some fun activities and while out at Bantock Park, they were so wonderful that a member of the public has even written to school to commend them. Y5 have been to West Midland Safari Park and staff have been so impressed by their behaviours and attitudes. Children from across KS2 went to Birmingham to sing with 5000 children in the Young Voices choir. Our children were so motivated and exemplary in every way and the conductor tells me it was the best night of the run. I could go on and on about every class this year—they have been amazing and I know you will all be as proud as we are.

But we also had some advisors in school this week looking at our SEND provision. I am delighted to say they thought the work Mrs Bayliss, Mrs Wainwright, staff and TAs do with our children with Special Needs is wonderful. However, they pointed out that the great work happening in classes around school by all our children, did not always show in the work they produced in their books. Children need to demonstrate more pride in the work they do, to show off the knowledge they have gained and the skills they have. This made us all stop and think. Is this something we demonstrate across all aspects of our school life? Could we all be doing more to instil this sense of pride in what we do? We want to really focus on ensuring that we do show off how fantastic our children are. So we will be having a push on having a pride in everything about our school life straight away, to make sure that we do!

**Pride in our Work** - a focus on the basic skills of capital letters, punctuation, handwriting, completing tasks to a high standard **Pride in our Attitudes and Behaviours** - having respect for others, including those who we may find different or difficult, our approach to learning—listening well, trying our best, not giving up and settling for less than what we can do, how do we walk around school, behave in class or on the playground, do we share, care, encourage each other.

**Pride in our Appearance** - how do we care for our belongings, look smart in our uniform, wear the correct PE kit. **Pride in our Organisational Skills** - taking care of our books, our classrooms, our environment, our equipment (in class and outside), coming to school on time, good attendance, remembering to bring the right equipment to school.

So we will be asking children to take more time, do things again, think about their actions. We will always look to do this in a positive manner, we want everyone to work towards a non-shouting school! It may mean a few yellow cards while we embed a higher expectation of behaviours around school or some playtime conversations or repeating of work. We will be sending out uniform reminders or query frequent lateness to school. Hopefully, this is all a short term push for long term benefits. We really need your support and encouragement at home to help children understand the importance of taking pride in ourselves and what we do. If they come home feeling that something has upset them, please talk about it and help them see the full picture with them to encourage a positive attitude towards dealing with problems. It's not easy to be green all the time, sometimes we get yellow and even red cards—but we can work on it together. 'Every Child Matters Every Day' and we want to make sure that 'Every Day' is the best it can be!
