What is Going On at Warstones!

The weather has certainly turned colder! Please do make sure your child has a coat coming to school as we will still be going outside whenever we can! Any gloves, scarves and hats must be named as they so easily get lost.

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The Local Authority Health and Safety team have issued guidelines under which we CAN have some Christmas productions live this year IF no further restrictions are put in place should COVID rates continue to rise. I must stress that this is not definite and we may have to cancel performances at short notice if we are advised to.

There are though, major restrictions as to what we can do.

Any event must be ticketed and we must have contact details of who is coming.

We are limited to the number of people we can have in the hall.

All COVID precautions must be in place—entering and exiting through the hall doors not coming through school, masks MUST be worn and hand sanitisers used at the doors. You must bring your ticket, we will also be screening at the door, asking if you have any symptoms before entering with the right to refuse entry if we think you are showing signs of the virus. There will be no refreshments and no toilet facilities available.

The biggest issue, that we know will be difficult for families and may be upsetting, is that to keep the numbers small enough for us to go ahead, we can only offer each child 1 adult ticket. We can have no exceptions, nor can we have pushchairs or younger siblings come with the adult. This has caused us so much angst on your behalf, but feel that the opportunity for the children to perform live is too important not to try and go ahead, even though it may cause families issues over who has the ticket. So we will film the performances as well, as we did last year, so everyone will be able to watch the show and share with wider family members as you wish. We ask for your understanding and support with this so that we can go ahead and make this as normal and memorable a Christmas as we can for the children.

(If your child is an all day attender, please let us know which performance you intend to come to, as we can still only issue one ticket).

Reception Performance Monday 13th December 9.30am

Tuesday 14th December 9.30am (Y1 parents only) KS1 performances

Wednesday 15th December 9.30am (Y2 parents only)

We know this is going to cause upset, we are trying to do the best we can and enable performances to go ahead but we do need your support with this. Please do not ask for exceptions to be made, as if we do for one we must do for all, and then it becomes impossible to put any performance on at all.

Please also do be aware that we may be instructed to cancel all public performances by Public Health and the council Health and Safety team at anytime if the rates of infection change in the city.
