# What is Going On at Warstones!

So we start a new lockdown on Thursday! But this time schools are remaining open so it is still going to be a lot of people coming together at the start and end of each day.

So we need to make sure that we tighten our practices to avoid transmission, especially then, when people are most vulnerable. Everyone knows the routes in and out of

school well now but we must not become complacent.

Please can all adults and over 12s coming on to the school site, wear a mask (except those with medical exemption).

# You must maintain social distancing between different households.

We see so many EY and KS1 parents walking round together but it is an essential lockdown rule that you should not mix. Also, parents do congregate outside the gates at the start and end of the day to chat and we must ask you to refrain from this or move elsewhere.

EY/KS1: Do not stop on the route round school to talk to others. The route must keep moving. Please do not wait in the coned area outside Nursery and KS1 or on the hatched areas.

Messages for staff must be e mailed, phoned or placed in the tray at the door, please do not stop to talk with staff on the door.

Children must stay by your side when walking around school and on the exit leaving school, not running on ahead and into other household bubbles. You must stay separate from other families.


PLEASE ARRIVE DURING YOUR 10 mins SLOT—do not come early and have to queue outside. The only people who may need to queue should be those who have children in both time slots of 8.35 and 8.45 am. If you arrive as close to 8.45 as possible then you should not have to wait long for the second group to be going in. If you arrive early, please wait away from school—in your car or on the grassy area over in front of the shops where you can safely distance from each other. We do not have the space to safely distance in front of school

**KS2:** Please do not wait to see your child walk down the path into school. As soon as they are through the gates, we have staff around so please do drop and leave.


We must reduce the number of people on site to avoid crowding and to ease social distancing. Therefore, when coming on to the school site, whether walking round or collecting from KS2, it is essential that there is just 1 adult plus any dependent children that have to come with you. Any older/secondary children or other adults should wait outside the school site till you come out.

It is so important that we stick to these rules if we are to keep the risk as low as possible. So far we have not had to send year groups home but many schools have. Please do not be offended if staff stop you, ask you to separate or to move on. We have a duty of care to everyone and we must maintain the safety procedures we have put in our risk assessment or we would not be able to open at all. Sadly, we have had parents and grandparents who have not followed the rules and I am afraid if this happens we will have to ask you not to come on site at all for the safety of others.

If any member of your household has symptoms of the virus you must not enter the school site. By law, that person must self isolate for 10 days from the start of symptoms, if there have been no symptoms but a positive test result you should isolate for 10 days from the result. You may return to school on day 11 if there has not been a high temperature for 48 hours and that person has been well. Others in the household should self isolate for 14 days from the positive persons symptoms starting or if someone begins with symptoms during this time, they should isolate for a further 10 days from the onset of these.
