School Rules at Warstones Primary

We have three simple rules to remember in school:

Be Safe, Be Responsible and Be Respectful.

All behaviours in school can relate to these rules.

The majority of our children follow these rules wonderfully and make good choices We have the following system of rewards in place to celebrate this.

Housepoints (with prizes and certificates for reaching certain milestones through the year).

Special events at the end of terms for highest housepoint earners.

Certificates for academic excellence, good behaviour, 'Children's Choice', lunchtime certificates.

Celebrity certificates at the end of term

Golden time for all children on green all week (or under 3 oranges)

Extra playtimes

In class rewards for good behaviours, attainment, pastoral care.

Likewise, if children make a poor choice, we use the 'Good to be Green' positive behaviour strategy which encourages them to consider what they have done and turn things round.

All children will start every morning **and** afternoon session on green. If they break a rule in class, they will be reminded of the correct behaviour expected, if they break the rule again they are given an orange card. They can then earn themselves back to green if they follow the rules. If they don't, and break the rule again, they go on to red. This will mean children are not on orange for a misdemeanour at the start of the day and go to red for something completely different at the end of the day. Children can earn class rewards if all the class are on green at the end of the morning or at the end of the afternoon.

If your child is given a red card, they will lose 5 mins from their Golden Time for each card they receive.

If your child's behaviour is causing concern leading up to a school trip or residential, there teacher will contact home to discuss this as the behaviour may make it unsafe for them to attend the trip. Fighting, stealing or disrespectful behaviour can result in a straight red card and being sent to the Assistant Head or Headteacher.

If the negative behaviour continues, a member of Senior Leadership Team will be called to either come and sit with the child in class or remove the child for a short period of reflection. This may result in a loss of playtime/lunchtime in addition to the red card consequence. At this point he class teacher will speck to the child's parents either by phone or in person at pick up time.

Playtimes and lunchtime. Children displaying unacceptable behaviours in the playground – fighting, disrespectfulness, bullying – will be managed in the same ways as in class, with the warning and use of cards. Any incidents at play/lunchtimes will be reported to the

class teacher so there is continuity in approach taken throughout the day.

In the event that **any person** posts libellous or defamatory comments on social media, they will be reported to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network and required to remove the comment immediately. Cyber bullying will be dealt with severely and any safeguarding concerns reported to the police.
