**Purpose and Impact**

I can develop multiple ideas in a story that include descriptive detail and in non-fiction that are factual and precise.

I can express a basic viewpoint, an opinion or promote an idea e.g. *I believe...*

I can maintain the main features of a genre/text type.

I can make sure my writing makes sense.

**Structure and Shape**

I can make my writing flow using:

- Pronouns
- Cohesive phrases
- Referring back to previous points

I can begin to use paragraphs by grouping ideas together.

I can use headings and sub-headings to group ideas.

I can signal openings and closings in both narratives and non-fiction e.g. *Early one morning.../ Eventually.../ Ultimately...*

**Sentence Structure**

I can use one word in isolation to grab the reader's attention e.g. *Stop!*

I can use increased detail in descriptions e.g. *precise words, descriptive noun phrases.*

I can use prepositions e.g. *in, on, behind, under.*

**Tenses**

I can use the present perfect form of verbs, instead of simple past e.g. *'He has gone out to play' / 'He went out to play.'*

**Conjunctions/ Complex sentences**

I can experiment with a widening range of conjunctions e.g. *while, although, so*

**Writer's technique**

I can write sentences that use repetition of key words for impact.

I can use the word 'like' to build a simile.

**Vocabulary**

I can choose words carefully to have an effect on the reader.

I can use some **red ambitious words** in my writing

**Adverbs/Adverbial Phrases**

I can use adverbs/adverbial phrases that:

- Position in time e.g. *soon after, later that day, as dawn broke*
- Build a relationship or cause e.g. *therefore, as a result*

**Punctuation (In addition to all previously taught punctuation) ^ . ? ! , ' .**

I can begin to use inverted commas for direct speech and other speech punctuation e.g. *punctuation inside inverted commas*

**Apply spelling rules into writing**

I can use a range of prefixes to extend repertoire of nouns e.g. *super-, anti-, auto-*

I can use 'a' or 'an' correctly

I can experiment with more complicated words built from a common word e.g. *dissolve, solution.*

**Handwriting and Presentation**

I can use cursive strokes to join letters that are adjacent and know which are best left unjoined.

I can show increased legibility and quality to handwriting.
